

## Symposium on Adaptive Management of Metropolitan Areas and Tokyo Bay - What Are the Best Practices from Around the World ? -

While the flow of revolution of population or industry in the center of Tokyo becomes strong much more, the waterfront of Tokyo Bay, such as deployment of a city reproduction project and construction rushes of a high rise apartment, is collecting limelights greatly. Moreover, social eyes are increasingly turned also to the environment by which Tokyo Bay, such as "frequent occurrence of red tide" and "the oil ball to the ODAIBA park drifting ashore", got sick.
